Austria	Degree-seeking EU students and exchange students don't have to pay tuition fees at public universities. They have to pay tuition fees at universities of applied sciences. Poland	Full-time EU students and students holding the Card of the Pole (Karta Polaka) do not have to pay tuition fees at public higher education institutions in Poland if the study program is conducted in Polish. For some programs taught in a foreign language, tuition fees may apply.	Non-EU students and part-time students have to pay tuition fees starting at about 2000 EUR per year.	[Tuition fees in Poland]
Portugal	Full time students enrolled in Bachelor's and Master's programs are charged an average tuition fee of approximately 950 - 1250 EUR per academic year. For third cycle programs (PhD degrees), the average tuition fee amounts to approximately 2500 - 3000 EUR per academic year.		[Tuition fees in Portugal]
Slovenia	Full-time EU students as well as students from countries with a reciprocal agreement with Slovenia don't have to pay tuition fees at public universities and colleges in Slovenia.		[Tuition fees in Slovenia]
Spain	Students pay tuition fees on a per-credit basis, starting at approximately 12.50 EUR per credit.		[Tuition fees in Spain]
