1. The evidence that Weisel provides to support the idea that they had creative ways of coping was that they would stick together and try to comfort each other.
2. They try to help each other out to not get in the other group.
3. Weisel says the prisoners made jokes and calmed each other to stay positive.
4. The prisoners support each other by giving reassurance throughout the entire selection. “I felt like kissing him. At that moment, the others did not matter! They had not written me down!” He is happy that he and his friends are safe.
5. “Today this is paradise compared to what the camp was two years ago.” This quote shows that . . .
6. They help each other by sharing items.
7. They talked with and gave secrets to one another.
8. They started making jokes, and calmed each other down.
9. The prisoners support each other with advice.
10. They stick together and try to stay confident in themselves, and also have support for each other.
